Requirements

Three years continuous sobriety

One year of active service experience in C.A.

Gainfully employed and/or financially stable

Term

Two year commitment

Attendance

- In order to maintain one's service position one must not miss two (2) consecutive SABA meetings (or more than 25% of the meetings in one's term) and must submit one's written report regardless of attendance/absence
- Attendance is defined as being physically present at the SABA business meeting with a written report ready to be given to the SABA body
- Either the Chair or Alternate Chair of each standing committee must be present at every SABA business meeting
- Defaulting on attendance requirements will result in dismissal from one's service position

Responsibilities

- Teaches the roles and responsibilities required of the Chips and Literature position to the Alternate Chair
- The Chips and Literature Chair works in cooperation with the Alternate Chair to fulfill the duties listed below:
 - Provides report at all SABA meetings, listing available funds, literature, and chips
 - Places and pays for orders through CAWS for shipment of C.A. books, pamphlets, chips, and medallions
 - Purchases "Big Book" and "Twelve and Twelve" at Alcoholics Anonymous (A.A.)
 Central Office
 - Responsible for the distribution of literature and chips to SABA C.A. H&I, Districts, groups, and members upon receipt of orders and payment
 - Oversees the Chips and Literature financial account in accordance with the World Service Conference (WSC) C.A. financial guidelines
