Requirements

Five years continuous sobriety
Three years of active service experience in C.A.

Term

Two year commitment

Attendance

- In order to maintain one's service position one must not miss two (2) consecutive SABA meetings (or more than 25% of the meetings in one's term) and must submit one's written report regardless of attendance/absence
- Attendance is defined as being physically present at the SABA business meeting with a written report ready to be given to the SABA body
- Either the Chair or Alternate Chair of each standing committee must be present at every SABA business meeting
- Defaulting on attendance requirements will result in dismissal from one's service position

Responsibilities

- Teaches the roles and responsibilities required of the Non-Profit Organization Committee position to the Alternate Chair
- The Chair works in cooperation with the Alternate Chair to fulfill the duties listed below:
 - Research and compile all applicable paperwork required to be registered as a non-profit organization in Alberta
 - Present proposed position requirements and the number of Directors deemed necessary to sit on the Board, to the SABA service body for ratification
 - Ensure election of Board of Directors by SABA service body
 - File all applicable paperwork and organize payment of fees required to be registered as a non-profit organization in Alberta
 - Maintain non-profit organization registration status once achieved
 - Oversee and liaise between the Board of Directors and the SABA service body
